Meeting Information

Registration

Annual meeting registration will take place at the New York Hilton. All delegates attending the meeting should fill out the enclosed Delegate Registration Card and present it to staff at the NCSC registration area on-site.

Voting

NCSC bylaws allow voting by mail, electronic means or in person. For this election cycle, NCSC will provide for voting by mail and in person at the meeting. Please note that pursuant to NCSC bylaws, NCSC Class T directors are elected by all NCSC Class T voting members. Under NCSC bylaws, no voting delegate can represent more than one member system.

To Vote in Person

Complete and sign (including the signature of an officer of your system) the enclosed Delegate Registration Card and present it to NCSC staff in the registration area. Inperson voting will occur during the NCSC Annual Meeting.

To Vote by Mail

- Complete and sign the enclosed Mail Ballot—no photocopies, emails or faxes will be accepted. Place the ballot in the return envelope and mail to Nicole DaDamio at NCSC. The NCSC bylaws specify that mail ballots must be received at NCSC headquarters by mail at least five business days (Monday, June 23) before the meeting to be counted.
- If you vote by mail and later decide that you prefer to vote in person, NCSC staff can help you revoke your mail ballot and register to vote at the business meeting.
